Ms. Sanchez presented Resolution 2023-05 and read the title.

On MOTION by Mr. Rick Singletary and seconded by Mr. Lamb, with all in favor, Resolution 2023-05, Hereby Accepting the Audited Financial Statements for the Fiscal Year Ended September 30, 2022, was adopted.

**SEVENTH ORDER OF BUSINESS** 

Discussion/Consideration of Stormwater Management Facility Operation and

Maintenance Plan for Fallschase

Residential

Ms. Sanchez presented the Stormwater Management Facility Operation and

Maintenance Plan, including exhibits that the District Engineer modified. Mr. van Assenderp

drafted the original Agreement and, more recently, Ms. Kilinski made additional modifications

to the Agreement.

Mr. Wynn reviewed the Operation and Maintenance Plan for the stormwater facilities,

and responded to questions regarding the wet retention pond, sand filter, treatment

mechanism for the stormwater, water retention and flood prevention. Ms. Sanchez asked for

Board approval, in substantial form, as further modifications must be made.

On MOTION by Mr. Lamb and seconded by Mr. Rick Singletary, with all in favor, the Stormwater Management Facility Operation and Maintenance Plan

for Fallschase Residential, in substantial form, was approved.

**EIGHTH ORDER OF BUSINESS** 

Ratification of Acquisition Improvements of

Ms. Cerbone stated she was recently contacted by Ms. Kilinski who recommended that

the Board, as a matter of record, ratify the Acquisition of Improvements documents, which

have already been executed but the Board should acknowledge seeing them and pose any

questions that they may have.

Discussion ensued regarding the asphalting, bond funds, Unit 5, interest rates, supply

chain, a solar farm and taxable bonds.

On MOTION by Mr. Yates and seconded by Mr. Lamb, with all in favor, the

Acquisition of Improvements and/or related documents, were ratified.

**NINTH ORDER OF BUSINESS** 

Acceptance of Unaudited Financial

Statements as of June 30, 2023

Ms. Sanchez presented the Unaudited Financial Statements as of June 30, 2023.

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Asked why \$16 million does not show on the balance sheet as a liability for the CDD, Ms. Cerbone stated the Unaudited Financials will not have the entire balance sheet. The CDD's full assets and full liabilities are reflected on the annual Audited Financial Reports.

On MOTION by Mr. Lamb and seconded by Mr. Rick Singletary, with all in favor, the Unaudited Financial Statements as of June 30, 2023, were accepted.

## **Staff Reports**

# A. Attorney: van Assenderp Law

**Mr. van Assenderp:** Are we going to have that meeting with the Realtors and everybody today?

**Mr. Yates:** No, there was no response.

**Mr. van Assenderp:** I want it to be clear that I am on the record that I really have advised the District and the Landowner. It is okay if it has not been done yet but the longer it goes.... A few years ago, someone wrote something that worked well with me and we noted some of your markings; do you remember who that was?

A Board Member: It may have been Chandler who did that.

Mr. van Assenderp: And that was good. It just covered some things that otherwise.... understanding what the CDD is and how one can inadvertently or innocently misrepresent something to a purchaser or to a media, has been a problem from time to time around the State and I am just trying to prevent that. It is not the District's job but there was a vote two or three meetings ago to ask the Developer to set up a briefing. My idea was to have a meeting with them and not give them any information in writing but give them a blank sheet of paper and a pen or use a computer. I want them to write down the following items:

1. Your CDD is a local government with a single limited special purpose.

- 2. What is the local government?
- 3. What is the single special purpose?
- 4. What is the limitation on that purpose?
- 5. What are the powers?
- 6. The funding, like assessments, are not taxes, for example.
- 7. How are the homeowners protected by the uniform collection methodology and related enforcements so that there is never any foreclosure.

**Mr.** van Assenderp: I want them to hear it and write it down instead of giving them a sheet with that list. I think it would be very helpful to do it on a repetitive basis whenever you have turnover. It is the people who work for the Developer who are selling the property or who answer questions from the media or from potential purchasers.

**Mr. Yates:** We don't have any of those people; those people are all independent real estate agents. The builders may have some salespeople.

**Mr. van Assenderp**: It could be any independent realtor.

**Mr. Yates:** As far as talking to builders, I talked to Horton and they were not very responsive.

**Mr. van Assenderp**: Can we just make sure the minutes reflect a recommendation from the District that this kind of briefing with people who deal with the media and people who sell and market the property be done, as just a request from the Board. It is not an emergency but as you start selling more property, just as a preventative measure. Local realtors need to understand it.

B. Engineer: Moore Bass Consulting, Inc.

Mr. Wynn reported the following:

- Phases 1, 2 and 3 were completed one year ago.
- Staff is in the process of getting Phase 6 accepted by the City, including annexation, plat recording, etc.
- Phases 4 and 5 are currently under construction; the completion time period is in less than six months.
- Staff is currently working on permitting for Phase 7.
